PERSONAL PROTECTION EQUIPMENT (PPE)

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Requirements:

- 1. Two to Three people.
- 2. Correct number of posts.
- 3. Desired number of shelves. (generally, 5 shelves per door minimum)
- 4. No tools necessary in assembly of shelves.

Getting Started:

Select desired post height by adjusting the post leveling bolts found at the bottom of the posts. Make sure that this post height is consistent on all of the posts.

Place one post, with seams facing the frame's retaining bracket, up against the retaining bracket. Pick up a metal clip, and slide it down the vertical post until it rests next to the bottom frame-retaining bracket. Fasten 8-18 x ½" screws through the clearance holes in the clip into the post to secure it.

In order to secure the post to the top-retaining bracket, pick up another clip and repeat the same process by sliding the clip down the post until it rests next to the top frame-retaining bracket. Fasten 8-18 x ½" screws through the top clip into the post to finish securing it to the frame. Repeat this process until all front posts are attached to frame. (See pictures below for more detail).





First Stand Procedure:

- 1. Locate materials.
 - a. Locate 2 posts to be placed behind the 2 front posts attached to frame.
 - b. Locate shelves and/or shelf spacers.
 - 2. Standing the posts upright.
 - a. Stand back post upright. (See picture below)
 - b. Orientate the back posts so that seams are facing toward the frame. Adjust the post to desired height with the leg leveling bolts found at the bottom.


NOTE:

Multiple shelf depth configurations may require a third row of posts to properly distribute the weight.

- i. For 24" & 27" shelves, hook the spacer in between the two posts to determine the back post's distance from the front post.
- ii. For shelves larger than 27" deep, use the shelves to determine the back post's distance from the front post. Insert the bottom shelf's front hooks into the 2 front posts at the desired level.

For all-level or all-gravity feed shelf configurations position the back post so that the rear-most shelf hook is inserted into the post.


For mixed level and gravity feed shelf configurations position the back post so that the rear-most shelf hook of the inclined shelf is inserted into the post.



- 3. Place the remaining shelves.
 - a. Insert the shelves from the rear of the stand. (The shelf hooks point toward the front of the shelf.) To provide gravity feed, angle the shelf downward by hooking it into a higher hook point on the back post than the hook point of the front post.
 - b. Once the shelves are in place, the stand is complete.
 - c. Check if rear post leveling bolts are adjusted to desired level.

- 4. Continue building stands.
- a. Locate an additional back post.
- b. Repeat steps 1 through 4.
- c. Repeat process until the desired number of stands is achieved. Make sure to check that rear post leveling bolts are adjusted to desired height.
